Dear Parishioners,

Every May, the Church celebrates our Blessed Mother. It is fitting that during the Month when Spring begins to get into full swing and new life abounds, we turn our hearts to the one through whom God brought new, eternal life to mankind. There are many aspects of Mary we can fruitfully ponder, but this year I'm drawn to reflect on one of Mary's titles: our hope.

To an outsider, this title may seem strange. Mary is not our creator, redeemer, or savior. In other words, she is not God and thus has no power to grant us what we most desire. One of our Protestant brethren would likely point out we should put our hope in God, not any creature. In a certain sense they are right. God and God alone can save us and turning to anyone or anything else is folly. However, they are incorrect in the assumption there is tension between God and Mary, as if she detracts from the honor due her Son.

There is not dysfunction in God's family. Our Lord and His mother are in perfect accord with each other. Christ delights in the praise His mother received and she delights in the worship given to Him. When we call Mary our hope, we are not taking anything away from our Lord. Quite the contrary. We are recognizing what the great good God has worked in her.

Mary was conceived without sin and remained in God's grace every moment of her life. Through her love and fidelity, she shows us the incredible heights human nature is capable of. When a soul lives in union with its Creator, without ceasing to be only human, it becomes so much more than it is on its own. God's goodness and beauty shine through the saint's humanity. In the words of St. Irenaeus, a 2nd century bishop and doctor of the Church, "The glory of God is man fully alive."

Mary is not our hope because we have confused her with God, she is our hope because she is what we yearn to become. The dreck of sin weighs even the holiest of us down. We sense there is much that needs to change within us and yet we feel the impossibility of being entirely free. Mary shows us definitively that it is possible. Jesus Christ has saved us, and through a life of faith, He will remake us.

We look forward to the next life when our humanity will be entirely healed. Until then, we struggle on against our sinfulness, striving to imitate our Lady in her perfect love. Mary is also our hope because she has taken us as her own and works to bring about the holiness of God within us. She is simultaneously mother of God, queen of heaven, and our mother. She shows forth the possibility for each one of us and helps to make it a reality. Blessed Virgin, our hope, seat of wisdom, pray for us.
