

The Ascension of the Lord May 12, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

The stoics were a school of pagan philosophers who believed one should never judge whether events are good or bad because one can never know what the final outcome will be. Instead of rejoicing or sorrowing at any particular occurrence, the stoic strove to focus on accepting whatever happened and living a virtuous life.

The disciples were perturbed by the idea of Christ leaving them. They clung to what they knew and were used to because there was a real fear the future would be worse. After years of Christ's presence in a bodily form, the disciples reasonably had difficulty imagining how He could be as or even more present to them after ascending to the Father. They mistook His bodily presence for the only way He could be present.

The stoics would have advised the disciples to simply accept the situation and carry on. There's a wisdom to this, as we often spend far too much time and energy evaluating the events of our life. It accomplishes very little besides inducing anxiety, hence our Lord's exhortation: "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Let the day's own trouble be sufficient for the day." (Mt 6:34)

The Christian approach is similar to the stoics in its effect of striving to accept whatever happens in peace but with a crucial difference. The stoic refrains from judgement because he recognizes his inability to predict the future. The Christian recognizes the same limitation, but adds to it the knowledge based on the certainty of faith that all events are guided by God's providence. A loving Father, not random chance, controls what happens to us, giving us confidence even apparently negative events lead to the good.

The Ascension is a perfect example. Christ returns to heaven to take His seat at the right hand of the Father, meaning the disciples will no longer be able to see Him. The bodily relationship the disciples are accustomed to will no longer exist, which appears indisputably negative. However, before leaving, Christ promised that He would send the Spirit, who would reveal all things to His followers and strengthen them.

The Spirit will indeed come, which we look forward to next weekend at Pentecost. By taking up residence within each Christian's soul, the Spirit also makes the Father and the Son present as well. Christ's departure thus results in an even greater intimacy than before, an intimacy that remains possible for us today.


